COFFEE

Brewing a pot of coffee may not seem like a task that furthers the kingdom of God, but our ministry mission is to be "fishers of men" in our community, using a hot cup of joe as our bait! We have a few ways to serve, and each of them helps us reach our goal of being a church known for loving on and serving every soul that steps through our doors, all the while pointing them to Jesus - the ultimate source of energy and joy in our lives!

Brewers

7:00AM - 9:15AM or 9:45AM - 10:30AM // 1X a Month

It wouldn't be a coffee ministry without the coffee! Come join our team as a brewer - it's an important job, it smells great, and it comes with unlimited coffee. What's not to love?

Set-Up Team

8:00AM - 9:30AM // Weekly/Biweekly/Monthly

Once the coffee is brewed, it's gotta make it out there somehow! That's where our set-up team comes in. Help us get the coffee where it needs to go, and make sure we have plenty of cups, lids, and all the fixin's too!

Attendants

9:45AM - 10:30AM // Biweekly/Monthly

An empty carafe is a sad carafe... And the rule also holds for sugar jars! Our early morning attendees go through a lot of coffee. This team makes sure we're ready to go again at 11 o'clock!

Hosts

9:00AM - 9:45AM or 10:30AM - 11:15AM // Weekly/Biweekly

Hosts serve not only as a friendly and familiar face to guests each week but also they also help straighten up the stations and make sure coffee and supplies are available in the busy period leading up to services.

Clean-Up Team

11:15AM - 12:15PM // 1X a Month

Our Clean-Up team helps put up supplies, deliver carafes to be washed, and return them to the "coffee closet" so they're ready for the following week. It's not a glamorous job, but it is so important!

Backup Volunteers

Not ready to fully commit? That's okay! We would love to have a group of volunteers who are willing to serve for special events, 5th Sundays, and as back-up for when vacations or illnesses leave us short on help. Let us know if you'd be willing to be added to our volunteer roster as an occasional helper.

GREETERS

What We Do

The simple answer? Greet people... but it's so much more than that!

Our 3 primary goals are to:

Welcome

The first and foremost task of a greeter is to welcome members and guests to our church. Once in the door, you are the first person that everyone sees. It's our desire make sure everyone knows right away that they are welcome and wanted at Woodstock! There is so much comfort in seeing a friendly smile, hearing a genuine "we're so glad you're here!", and getting an earnest offer of help navigating if needed.

Walk

Our large campus can be overwhelming to visitors. Take the opportunity to walk them where they need to go. It's much more personal than pointing or giving directions, and also gives you the chance to tell them about different ministries and upcoming events. This simple act will help them form a personal connection with our church.

Worship

Serving God is an act of worship, but that's not the only reason we included worship in our service areas! We want you to invite people to worship alongside you. Attending church is about more than hearing a sermon or singing praise songs. God instituted the church for us to build relationships with other believers. We can help that happen by inviting others to worship alongside us!

Ask guests if they know anyone at our church. If they don't, invite them to sit with you and your family during worship. Introduce them to others from your Sunday School class, or even bring them along with you. Help them begin to build relationships at First Baptist Woodstock, starting with you!

Where We Serve

We have a campus map and a plan to place people where they need to be... If there is a place you are already familiar with or would prefer to serve, please let us know. Or, our team leader will assign you to the spot on campus where there is the greatest need. We hope to place greeters in set "assignments" to help build familiarity with those who are passing by you regularly.

When We Serve

Volunteers can choose to serve for one or more service hours; we recommend serving weekly or biweekly.

8:00AM Service - 7:45AM - 8:10AM 9:30AM Service - 9:10AM - 9:40AM 11:00AM Service - 10:40AM - 11:10AM

If you have an irregular schedule, additional service roles, or can only serve once a month let us know so we can coordinate coverage and make the most of your service. We also need a special team for 5th Sundays and our special events, let us know if you are willing to fill in as special opportunities arise!

PARKING LOT

What We Do

The simple answer? Direct traffic... But it is so much more than that!

Our 3 primary goals are to:

Develop Relationships

Our Parking Lot attendants are front and center when people arrive on our campus- you will often be the first person they encounter at church each week! Having the opportunity to offer a friendly welcome, answer questions, and give directions around campus means you will quickly become a familiar face, and this can go such a long way toward building relationships that will make First Baptist Woodstock "home".

Display Dedication

We won't lie about it - working outside in Georgia can be hard! There will be days when it's pouring rain, weeks when it's bitterly cold, and months when it is hot and sticky... But the dedication of our parking lot volunteers communicates a crucially important message to visitors and members of our church: Our church practices what we preach. We love, serve, and value others. And we do it faithfully!

Devote Time to Pray

Parking Lot ministry isn't just about pointing people in the right direction, it also gives you a valuable time and opportunity to pray for each person who arrives on campus Sunday mornings. We have time set aside every morning for our volunteers to gather in corporate prayer, and we encourage you to pray

individually over your section of the parking lot as well as specific families and vehicles throughout the morning. We have printed prayer cards that you can place on vehicles to let them know they were prayed over. Avoiding accidents and confusion is important - but the very best way to serve and love on our people is to pray for them faithfully!

How to Serve

Directing traffic isn't the only way to serve in the parking lots on Sunday mornings. You can also join our team as a crossing attendant, parking lot greeter, trolley station host, or on our signage team.

When We Serve

Volunteers can choose to serve for one or more of our 3 service shifts serving on a weekly or biweekly basis; or a once-a-month for the entire morning.

Shift 1 - 9:00AM to 9:45PM Shift 2 - 10:35AM to 11:15PM

Shift 3 - 12:15PM to 12:45PM

If you have an irregular schedule, additional service roles, or can only serve once a month, we can coordinate coverage to make the most of your service.

We also need a team to help during special events.

SENIOR VALET

Most of our senior adults have spent decades investing and serving in the church, both locally and internationally. As they age, many will face health and mobility issues. This can make attending church on Sunday morning a daunting task - especially when facing extreme temperatures, bad weather, or a long walk to the entrance. We want to remove every possible barrier that could keep someone home on Sunday mornings.

We love and are grateful for our senior adults, and serving them through our valet is a great, tangible way to express that love, respect, and appreciation! Many of our seniors live alone and may have few opportunities to engage and visit with people throughout the week. This ministry gives us the opportunity to make sure that everyone who steps foot on our campus is seen, heard, and acknowledged. Take a few extra minutes to ask someone how they're doing, share an anecdote from your week, and help them to feel welcomed and wanted. A simple, friendly gesture can be such an encouragement to those who are feeling lonely.

How to Serve

Our ministry has teams for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Sunday of each month, and also maintains a 5th Sunday team that serves 3-4 times per year.

Openers

7:30AM - 9:30AM // 1X a Month (Must be 25 years old or older)

Openers serve as the lead driver for the team, and park for the 8:00AM and 9:30AM service hours. Our openers also participate in the time we have dedicated to pray over the vehicles of the families we serve each week.

Drivers

9:00AM - 12:45PM // 1X a month (Must be at least 25 years old or older)

Drivers park for the 9:30AM and 11:00AM service hour, and also help retrieve cars when church is dismissed. Drivers also participate in the time we have dedicated to pray over the vehicles of the families we serve each week.

Valet Hosts

If you're not able to drive but want to serve with a spouse, friend, or parent, we would love to have you as a part of our team of hosts to welcome attendees each week. Holding an umbrella or door, carrying snacks to Sunday School, or just walking and visiting with an attendee can go a long way to helping and loving on those who are here on Sunday morning.

Back-Up Volunteers

Not ready to fully commit? That's okay! Things like illness, pregnancy, and vacations can temporarily set us back a team member. Would you be willing to occasionally fill in the gaps so we can continue serving our senior adults?

SINGLE-PARENT VALET

What We Do

The simple answer? Park cars... But it is so much more than that!

Our 3 primary goals are to:

Ease the Burden

Getting a family with young kids to church is never an easy task. Dealing with cold or hot temperatures, bad weather, and a big parking lot is a huge job, especially for parents who are on their own, even if it's just for the morning!

Encourage Parents

It is easy for parents to get discouraged when the tank is on empty, their youngest lost their shoes, and they've already missed five minutes of worship. Take a moment to encourage a parent, let them know you've been there too, and thank them for setting an example of making church a priority. It can go far toward calming an overwhelmed parent and put them in the right mindset to do what they came to do; spend time investing and growing in their relationship with Christ.

Engage Families

As a first point of contact for visitors arriving to First Baptist Woodstock, as well as getting a front-row seat to family demographics, we are uniquely equipped to lead people to ministries that meet their needs. This is a great time and opportunity to help visitors get plugged in and informed about programs like Awana & Cubbies, Thrive, YANO, VBS, and our Kidzstock playground.

How to Serve

Our ministry has teams for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Sunday of each month, and also maintains a 5th Sunday team that serves 3-4 times per year.

Openers

7:30AM - 11:00AM // 1X a Month (Must be 25 years old or older)

Openers serve as the lead driver for the team, and park for the 8:00AM, 9:30AM, and 11:00AM service hours. Our openers also participate in the time we have dedicated to pray over the vehicles of the families we serve each week.

<u>Drivers</u>

9:00AM - 12:45PM // 1X a Month (Must be 25 years old or older)

Drivers park for the 9:30AM and 11:00AM service hours, and also help retrieve cars when church is dismissed. Drivers also participate in the time we have dedicated to pray over the vehicles of the families we serve each week.

Valet Hosts

If you're not able to drive but want to serve with a spouse, friend, or parent, we would love to have you as a part of our team of hosts to welcome attendees each week.

Backup Volunteers

Not ready to fully commit? That's okay! Things like illness, pregnancy, and vacations can temporarily set us back a team member. Would you be willing to occasionally fill in the gaps so we can continue serving our single-parents?

TROLLEYS

Serving in the Trolley ministry may seem like more fun than work, but anyone who has arrived on campus a few minutes behind schedule on a Sunday can attest to how important and valuable this ministry is!

For most visitors, and even members, making it onto campus Sunday morning is just the beginning... Figuring out where to go and how to get there sometimes can be overwhelming! Our trolley stops are spread throughout campus and are easy to identify. Attendees can hop on our trolleys and receive a warm welcome, take a quick ride, and even learn a little about our church on the way. The simplicity and convenience of the trolley experience helps minimize the "big church" feeling, and give people an opportunity to begin building relationships before they even enter our doors..

When you add in the safety benefits of reducing the number of vehicles and pedestrians needing to make their way through the busiest parts of campus, it becomes even more apparent why this ministry is so important!

How to Serve

Driving isn't the only way to serve in the Trolley ministry! You can also join our team as a trolley host or hostess. Hosts will assist riders onto the trolley; ensure riders know where they are parked; make brief announcements, and provide a warm welcome and introduction to campus. Have fun with it and make the role your own!

When We Serve

Volunteers can choose to serve for one or more of our 3 driving shifts, serving on a weekly or biweekly basis.

Shift 1 - 9:00AM to 9:45PM Shift 2 - 10:35AM to 11:15AM Shift 3 - 12:15PM to 1:00PM

If you have an irregular schedule, additional service roles, or can only serve once a month, we can coordinate coverage to make the most of your service.

We also need a team to help during special events.



USHERS

Ushers may not be the first person one encounters when arriving on campus, but they play a crucial role in helping guests feel welcome and comfortable, and are often the last impression one has before the service begins. Our ushers contribute greatly to the environment within our worship services, and have an important task in welcoming and seating guests, facilitating an appropriate atmosphere for worship, and in receiving the tithes and offerings.

Ushering is a ministry that is laid out in both the Old and New Testament, and their tasks and responsibilities embody what it means to practice hospitality. If you are looking for a ministry role that allows you to serve the Lord while also attending and participating in the service each week, being an Usher might be a great fit for you!

Where We Serve

Ushers are placed within each section of both the Worship Center and the Chapel. We have a map of campus that outlines where we position our ushers, but there is so much value in having you serve somewhere where you'll familiar with the surroundings and the people, and somewhere you'd like to be. Let us know where you think would be a good fit! We will always do our best to place you where the Lord is calling you.

When We Serve

Ushers need to be in place near the entry points for their section before the service starts, and will serve during the worship service they typically attend.

We ask that ushers be in place by the following times:

9:30AM service - In place by 9:10AM 11:00AM service - In place by 10:45AM

PRESCHOOL MINISTRY

The Preschool Sunday School Ministry exists to provide a fun, inviting, and safe place for preschoolers, ages six weeks through Pre-K, where they can learn foundational truths about God. We do this through play, stories, crafts, games, worship, and more. We provide screening, training, a security system, and a secure building to help make this environment safe.

How to Serve

Impacters

9:10AM - 10:45AM or 10:40AM - 12:30PM - Weekly/Biweekly

Impacters are Sunday School Teachers and/or teaching assistants committed to a particular class each week. Impacters serve a vital role in the lives of our preschoolers: They are a consistent, familiar face. They care for the physical and spiritual needs of the children in their class, as well as manage and run the classroom.

Imprinters

9:10AM - 10:45AM or 10:40AM - 12:30PM - 1X a Month

Imprinters serve as assistants or helpers to our Sunday School teachers. They assist the teachers in caring for the physical and spiritual needs of the children.

iKids Worship Assistant

11:00AM - 12:15PM - Weekly/Biweekly

Assists in leading worship with 3-4-year-olds. This includes helping with singing, learning bible verses, games, and helping to tell the bible story. Assistants should available to step in if the Worship leader is unavailable that day to teach.

Welcome Desk Greeters

9:10AM - 10:45AM or 10:40AM - 12:30PM - Weekly, Biweekly or Monthly

Greeters are the first face of Preschool to our visiting families. They welcome, register, and show the visitors to their classes, and also help the parents navigate our campus.



ELEMENTARY MINISTRY

WOODSTOCK KIDS

The purpose of Woodstock Kids is to lay the foundation for boys and girls to come to know Christ and disciple them on their journey to becoming fully devoted followers of Christ. Our desire is to make each child feel welcomed, loved, and accepted in an atmosphere of creativity and fun.

How to Serve

Group Leaders

Our Group Leaders are responsible for leading their students in a way that helps them grow in their relationship with the Lord. Using the curriculum provided, they will plan and teach their Bible lesson. We also ask that Group Leaders reach out to their students each week, via phone, email, or mail. We ask that our Group Leaders commit to serving through the school year, August – July.

Group Assistants

Our Group Assistants help provide an inviting atmosphere by welcoming students and their parents as they arrive to class. They will help students and parents with our sign-in process, and make sure the roll is filled out correctly. Group Assistants can also reach out to their students each week, via phone, email, or mail. Most importantly, Group Assistants help keep the students engaged in what they're learning on Sunday.

<u>Greeters</u>

Our Greeters are responsible for greeting families who are visiting our church for the first time and helping them feel at home. Our greeters help new families fill out the visitor card, walk them to their assigned group, and introduce them to their Leader and/or Assistant. Our Greeters serve throughout their assigned service hour by helping collect rolls and submit counts to the main office. Our Greeters can serve at either the Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd-Grade Welcome Desk or at our 3rd, 4th, and 5th-Grade Welcome Desk.



KIDZPLACE

KidZPlace is a worship experience that is designed specifically for our K-3rd Graders in a fun and energetic environment that allows children to grow deeper in Biblical truths and teaches children how to live out what they learn from God's Word. The KidZPlace worship experience incorporates live drama and worship, puppets, and media to teach God's Word each Sunday. Serving in KidZPlace is a great opportunity to invest in the next generation and touch many lives with the Gospel. No material preparation is required for these volunteer positions.

How to Serve

Greeters

9:30AM & 11:00AM - Weekly/Biweekly/Monthly

As a greeter you will be one of the first faces the children will see on Sunday mornings when they arrive to KidZPlace. Our Greeters are responsible for greeting and welcoming our first-time visitors and members and assisting them with the check-in process. Our Greeters help to make each family feel welcomed and loved.

VIPS (Very Important Partners)

9:30AM & 11:00AM - Weekly/Biweekly/Monthly

As a VIP, you will engage the children as you sit with them, model worship, and assist them with needs they might have during KidZPlace.

Game Room Leaders

9:30 & 11:00 - Weekly/Biweekly/Monthly

As a Game Room Leader, you will help walk a group of kids from the KidZPlace theater to the KidZPlace Game Room. Our Game Room Leaders oversee the children as they play games for the last 15 minutes of KidZPlace. Parents will pick their children up from the Game Room, and Game Room Leaders will assist with this pick up process.

Drama & Worship Team Members

Serve on a rotation throughout the year

Our Drama and Worship Team Members deliver our Bible lessons each week through acting and worship, playing a key role in portraying the real-life Bible applications and delivering the Biblical lessons. Anyone 5th grade and older can audition for the Drama Team, anyone 4th grade and older can audition for our Worship Team.

Drama Directors

Serve on a rotation throughout the year

As a Drama Director, you will be responsible for inspiring our young actors/ actresses in their roles. You will assist with directing these actors by giving them stage direction, line delivery, and characterization.

THRIVE SPECIAL NEEDS MINISTRY

THRIVE's mission is to partner with families, build relationships, and provide an environment where individuals, regardless of their abilities, can THRIVE as disciples of Jesus.

THRIVE

How to Serve

Welcome Team

This team serves as the face of our ministry, and has the opportunity to meet and build relationships with our volunteers and families. The Welcome Team especially helpful in facilitating smooth check-in and check-out processes.

Buddies

Buddies are paired one-on-one with students, and get to be a friend to them! Send your student a note when they are out, encourage them, and help them to become active participants in learning God's word. Don't worry; we won't throw you in unprepared! Our training and coaching program is designed to help equip you to serve our students confidently and well.

Room Leaders (18+)

Room Leaders use their gifts and talents to lead activities in our Bible, Music, Art, and Play rooms. Using our curriculum from Answers in Genesis, leaders will study and prepare 1 lesson per month (12 per year). We'll also want you to help recruit and train new volunteers, and be faithful in praying for our students and their families!

Coaches (18+)

Thrive Coaches help lead and develop our Buddy program, and serve as buddy mentors. Our coaches are required to have a Special Education background.

and will share techniques and training that supports our Buddies and enables them to grow and invest in their partnered students.

Medical Team

Given that our ministry serves many students who have various medical and developmental disabilities, our ministry maintains a team of medical professionals who are available to address any issues that could arise. If you have a medical background and would like to serve on a rotation or "on-call," we would love to have you as part of the team!

When We Serve

Volunteers serve weekly or biweekly, for one or more service hours.

8:00AM Service Hour - 7:45AM - 9:30AM 9:30AM Service Hour - 9:15AM - 11:00AM 11:00AM Service Hour - 10:45AM - 12:30PM

Looking for opportunities outside of Sunday mornings? We would love to have a group of volunteers who are willing to serve for special events, 5th Sundays, and as back-up for when vacations or illnesses leave us short on help. We also have both volunteer and paid opportunities to provide respite care and a night out for our Thrive Parents/Caregivers throughout the week. Let us know if you'd be willing to be added to our volunteer roster as an occasional helper!

STUDENT MINISTRIES

MIDDLE SCHOOL

We exist to make disciples who have been changed by the gospel, are connected relationally, and live missionally.

How to Serve

Lead Teacher

Our Lead Teachers are responsible for leadership of the class and leading the class in Bible Study. We ask that they attend Small Groups weekly, prepare and follow the curriculum provided, and build relationships with students in their Small Group.

Assistant Teacher

Assistant Teachers are responsible to assist in teaching, help the class stay focused, interact and follow up with students, and help plan activities. We ask that they attend Small Groups weekly, assist the Lead Teacher, and reach out to build relationships with students in their Small Group.

Coordinator & Greeter

8:00AM, 9:30AM, and 11:00AM on Sundays

Coordinators and Greeters are responsible for the administrative details for each Small Group hour. We ask that they arrive 15 minutes prior to their time each week, and that they build relationships with and encourage the Small Group Leaders for that service hour. They will greet students and assist new families as they come into the Warehouse. They will also collect rolls from each Small Group and fill out the attendance sheet for that hour.

Café Worker

8:00AM, 9:30AM, and 11:00AM on Sundays

Café Workers greet students and collect money as they purchase café items. They also straighten the café area and restock items before the next hour begins. We ask that Café Workers arrive 15 minutes prior to the start of their Small Group hour.

Other Opportunities to Serve

If you can't commit to Sundays, we also have opportunities for you to join our Wednesday night Pulse team! Whether it be greeting and helping at our welcome desk, working in our café, helping our security team, counseling students or supervising throughout the night, we can find a place to get you plugged in!

HIGH SCHOOL

How to Serve

Connect Groups

Lead Teacher

Lead Teachers prepare a lesson each week using the curriculum plan provided.

They also attend Connect Group weekly and build relationships with the students in their Connect Group.

Relational Leader

Relational Leaders focus on intentionally building relationships with students inside and outside of their Connect Groups. They attend Connect Groups weekly, and follow up with first-time visitors to the group.

Community Leader

Community Leaders intentionally build relationships with their students inside and outside of Connect Groups. They attend connect groups weekly, and plan a quarterly activity for their Connect Group outside of Sunday mornings. Community Leaders also plan service opportunities on the campuses where their students attend high school.

Coordinators

Coordinators encourage and build relationships with our Connect Group leaders at each service hour. They serve each week for the duration of the service hour, and manage administrative tasks like collecting rolls and filling out attendance sheets.

Café Workers

Café workers arrive 15 minutes prior to the start of the service hour to set up the café and begin brewing coffee for the teachers and leaders. They are responsible for greeting students and collecting money for any student purchases in the time leading up to Connect Groups. They also straighten the café area in preparation for the following service hour.

Other Opportunities to Serve

If you can't commit to Sundays, we also have opportunities for you to join our Wednesday night Epicenter team! Whether it be greeting and helping at our welcome desk, working in our café, helping our security team, counseling students or supervising throughout the night, we can find a place to get you plugged in!

MUSIC MINISTRY

WORSHIP CHOIR

How to Join

Enrollments are open year-round to any church member 18+, and an audition is not required! You can fill out our registration forms online or at one of our Wednesday Night rehearsals.

What's Expected

Worship Choir members are to be "lead worshippers." That means they are to be prepared both spiritually and musically.

All members are expected to attend a weekly rehearsal on Wednesdays from 6:30PM - 8:00PM in the Main Worship Center (W-Building) to learn songs that can be used in our weekly Sunday services. First Baptist Woodstock hosts a weekly fellowship dinner immediately prior to rehearsal, and excellent child care is provided.

Sunday services are the priority of this choir. We have the privilege of leading worship every Sunday morning in our 9:30AM worship service, and members are expected to attend unless providentially hindered.

ORCHESTRA

How to Join

Orchestra enrollments are open year-round to students and adults who have at least 3 years of experience on their instrument. Enrollees are required to go through an audition process before joining the orchestra.

What's Expected

Orchestra members are to be "lead worshippers." That means they are to be prepared both spiritually and musically.

All members are expected to attend rehearsals on Wednesdays from 6:30PM - 8:00PM in the Main Worship Center (W-Building), and on Sundays from 4:30PM - 6:00PM in the Orchestra Rehearsal Room. AUDIO TEAM

How to Serve

Front of House Mixer

Our Front of House Sound Team helps balance and blend the audio for everyone within the worship service. They play a huge part in making sure we provide a great atmosphere for worshippers to have a meaningful encounter with the living God.

Monitor Mixer

Our Monitor Mixers are the first line of support for the musicians leading worship on stage during the service. Their job is to make sure each musician can hear everything through their in-ear monitor in order to perform at their best and ensure we have a beautiful and God-honoring worship experience.

Broadcast Mixer

Our Broadcast Mixers manage the sound for our on-demand services, podcast, and online video streaming. They ensure that each broadcast can be heard and understood even by believers across the world.

Stage Manager

Stage Managers are the unsung heroes of all that you see take place on stage on Sunday mornings. They work with and coordinate all the moving parts you see on the stage during a service - whether it's making sure all of the microphones and equipment are in place and ready to go, communicating with the worship team or speaker, or transitioning the stage for the beginning of a

sermon. They ensure the service runs seamlessly, and they often problem-solve and fix issues before it's even apparent something went wrong!

VIDEO TEAM

How to Serve

Director

Our Director leads the team with instructions prior to services and "calls" the camera shots during the service.

Producer

Our Producers attend the sound check on Sunday mornings and work with the Director to lead the Media Team. They also help the Words Team by making sure they know the order of service, and what's coming up next.

Words Crew

The Words Crew supplies the lyrics for the congregation and choir and projects the sermon notes during the service. They also roll any videos that need to be played during the service.

Camera Crew

Our Camera Crew is in charge of the fixed and roving cameras used throughout service to capture what's going on.

Shading Crew

Our Shading Crew acts as the camera engineer throughout service; they make sure the iris is open or closed, and that we have an acceptable shot.

Lighting Crew

Our Lighting Crew manages the lighting during service by running the cues that are programmed and provided by our staff lighting director during the week.

Record/Playback Crew

Our Record/Playback Crew make sure we are able to capture and simulcast the "Pastor's Moment" and the sermon during the 9:30AM Chapel Service.

Instagram Story Lead

Our Instagram Story Leads create exciting, engaging story content that captures many aspects and angles of the Sunday morning experience. If you are creative, have an eye for detail, can capture exciting moments, and work well with a team, then this might be a good fit for you! We also look for those who have phone photography and video experience, are confident with the Instagram interface, and who can interact well with others.

Copywriter

Our Copywriters work closely with our Instagram Story Lead to help create well-written content and captions for posts. A good Copywriter is highly creative, works well with others even under pressure and has strong written communication skills and an eye for detail.

Facebook Live Response & Live Tweet Lead

This team acts as the voice of Woodstock, encouraging and interacting with our live viewers during the service, as well as vocalizing quotes and important moments from the service as they happen. Successful leads are self-motivated, reliable, confident communicators with attention to detail, and a positive and professional online presence. They must also have a full understanding of social media needs, relationships, and platforms.

Chat Room Lead

Our Chat Room Leads engage our livestream audience through the Chatroom of Church online. We look for leads who have, first of all, a love for the body of Christ and a desire to encourage, engage, and pray for those who view our services around the world. We also want those who are comfortable interacting online, have great written communication skills, and who are able to graciously redirect conversations back to the main focus.

Photography Team

Our volunteer photographers combine technical proficiency with artistry to capture images of people, events, and artists. Like most photographers, you will attempt to portray feelings, thoughts, and other information without the use of words. Photographers should be comfortable speaking to strangers and asking them to pose for pictures. Volunteers are asked to provide their own equipment, which generally includes a camera and one or more lenses to record the elements of light and composition in unique and creative ways.
